1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

As per the affiliating university, Akkamahadevi Women's University, Vijaypura, the institution provides learning sources for Arts and Commerce streams incorporating the latest pedagogical skills with digital expertise needed to the students. Education is imparted to live independently with no social and community barriers. The institution serves according to the Vision of the College based on Dasoha Philosophy, "Teaching and Learning for the sake of livelihood is an ordinary life. 1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Feedback Obtained

The Feedback contains several questionnaire to collect impression from various stakeholders. It is collected from students also. The Principal, Students' welfare officer, IQAC Coordinator Students' Academy Advisor and Students representatives analyse at the institution level. The management also demands when required and necessary. After feedback there is proper action takes. Stakeholders satisfaction is assured when the feedback is about infrastructure and learning resources. There is a continuous review made of the infrastructure and learning resources. There are committees formed to collect suggestions and recommendations are upgraded. They are maintained with the support facilities. The new demands of industry, trade and commerce, market and business are identified and action is taken. Through the review feedback there is a structured feedback taken from students, alumni, parents, academic experts. The Feedback Committee Constituted under the IQAC conducts meeting and analyses the feedback and tackles it. They recapitulate the course objectives, contents, warning outcomes and assessment and put up the recommendations. Class Representatives while attending the meeting every month are given the feedback. It is also taken to the classrooms. Every year this is carried on. Any urgent problem is obtainded and solved immediately by the authority. Some other problems in need of management decision are put forth before the authorities and solved accordingly. Some general feedback which consists of overall facilities like, hostel cleanliness and hygine, computer laboratory is taken into consideration and solved with the help of the concerned authority. 2.3.2 - Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Yes, students mentoring system is available in the institution. This system is a regularly and actively conducted every year. All faculty members are given 21 students each under their wing to mentor the students. A separate register is maintained to write details about each student. Information of the student is sought through a typed proforma in which the student enters the details. It is collected and filed for any reference. It also carries a passport size photo. Remedial coaching classes are conducted for those who need more attention. Special classes are arranged by the visiting and great lectures. The alumni also find pleasure in helping the students by engaging classes and motivational speeches for career development. There are career options regarding placements. Encouragement is sufficiently given to students to participate in various activities like seminars, workshops and special classes for slow learners. The mentees are taken special care by the mentors regarding placement cell, youth Festival, Cultural fest, Grievance cell, Co-curricular activities. The mentors meet the students to provide healthy atmosphere in the family and society, to create congenial atmosphere in the college, corridors, library. Class Representatives elected by the class play a vital role in maintaining healthy rapport between the office, teachers and the class peers. They monitors and help the slop learners to improve their standards. Each department makes it mandatory to organise seminars, group discussions, remedial classes, mock tests, quiz, personality development workshops, self-defence skills, life skills, earn while learn schemes are

introduced. The advanced learners, and faculty members strive seriously to participate in research based activities, field visits, project work. Which add to the extra knowledge to the prescribed syllabus. All these activities are monitored ultimately by the principal which enhances the morale of the faculty and students. The results every semester are commendable which reflects the commitment of teacher and taught. The overall personality of the students is developed during the three-year course of every student.

2.5.2 – Reforms initiate	.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)								

Continuous Internal Evaluation is mandatory. Every semester Internal Assessment Tests are conducted. It is part of teaching-learning process. Syllabus is taught according to the teaching plan already sketched at the beginning of the semester. Assignments are regularly given, checked and returned to the students for corrections. Reading the text, presenting seminar papers on the topics from syllabus are regular. Group discussions are organised with a group of 3-6 in the classrooms. Writing on the board for the convenience of slow learners is also practised. Field visits to nearby rural areas are planned as part of learning process. Semester internal exams are conducted as per the direction of the affiliating university. Knowledge is imparted through classroom activities and marking attendance is made mandatory. Students overall participation is in continuous observation. The slow learners are identified on the basis of their participation in the classroom, pass percentage, punctuality and personal interaction. Remedial Classes are arranged for slow learners. Revision lectures help the students recapitulate the topics covered previously. Periodical meetings are conducted, academic counselling is organised, and parent-teacher student meeting also help students enhance their rapport and Communication. The internal Assessment tests are conducted, time-table for the test is framed by the concerned faculty convener member of Continuous Internal Evaluation, question papers are set by the subject teachers, students write their CIE in rooms allotted to them, the faculty is designated duties according to the timetable. The test paper are evaluated and given to students. Test books are printed by the institution and bought by students. Marks based on attendance, presentation of seminar, assignments and the score of the written test is totaled and sent to the affiliated University within the stipulated date following than directions.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The affiliating university prescribes c calendar of events before the beginning of the academic year. Accordingly adhering to the calendar the institution prepares the college calendar, along with the departmental activity schedule for the limpid functioning the curriculum is enriched through related activities like special lectures by scholars from other colleges or subject experts, great lectures, workshops, seminars, group discussion, project work and field visits. The academic calendar is framed by the faculty assigned, in consultation with principal which include all activities of the college and also the conducting of CIE and examination. This calendar is displayed on the college website, displayed on notice board and circulated amongst faculty and department for proper execution of the activities. For reference a copy of the academic calendar of the year 2019-20 is enclosed. The academic calendar is prepared for various programs following the academic schedule, guide lines and timelines. Regarding the annual, cultural and sports meet schedule 1. Beginning of the academic session 2. Semester working days 3. Term Examination schedule. Annual sports meet, Cultural Meet. 4. End Term theory and practical Examination schedule 5. Vacation Schedule. This year due to COVID-19, there were several changes from last week of March 2020. The entire system underwent changes therefore, the institution updated the university's instructions following and adhering to the changes.

4.4.2 – Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website, provide link)

The institution after forming the committees has assigned enough funds for maintenance and repairs of the infrastructure. Institution makes budgetary provision categorised under different head for maintaining and utilizing the campus infrastructure facilities. There are various monitoring committees formed to observe the allocated funds being utilized. There are committees such as Library Committee, Laboratory Maintenance Committee, Sports Committee, Repair Maintenance Committee. For the maintenance and upkeeping of the infrastructure, facilities and equipments of the institution a systematic procedure is followed. The departments concerned maintain a stock register file which is physically verified by the office superintendent. The Head of the Department is responsible for the verification of the annual stock. It must be reported or brought to the notice of the Principal. The library maintenance is a regular activity maintained by the library assistant with the help of an attendant. They are monitored by a maintenance committee or convener. The laboratory are taken care of the concerned department. Any demands or misfunctioning is reported to the Principal. Immediate repairs or adjustments are done not hampering the routine work. Maintenance of the college campus, discipline and cleanliness is undertaken by the committee assigned. There are regular inspection done, any irregularities are immediately approached to the Principal whereby instant action is taken. The Principal, herself also keeps inspecting regularly. The Women's Hostel for students is monitored by a Hostel monitoring committee. This committee looks into cleanliness of the campus, rooms, kitchen etc. the quality and quantity of food supplied is also keenly observed. While learning the premises permission is to be sought from the warden and if learning the station the ward has to seek permission from the Principal. After learning about the genuine reason to leave the ward is permitted. Outsourcing is done for maintenance and repairing of IT infrastructure such as computers updating softwares, Xerox machine LCD's by the committee assigned. Maintaining furniture, electrification, plumbing, are all outsourced. Maintenance of reading room, research room, stock verification is done regularly by the library staff.

5.3.2 – Activity of Student Council & representation of students on academic & administrative bodies/committees of the institution (maximum 500 words)

The Students Academic "Kala-Vani" is the body formed as the Student Council and representation of students. 7.1.7 – Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly (at least five)

Water recycling -5000 litres. Plastics free campus cotton cloth bag, gifted saplings to guests [Gulbarga Smart City - Smt. Vijaylaxmi Sheelvant Sriresh] The institution has initiated for "Gulbarga Smart City" five of the meetings of the Chamber of Commerce, SMASS and Mr. Sriresh from Hyderabad collaboratively organised in the campus. The institution has been given two mini buses by the Management for student's transportation. Cotton cloth bags are stitched and sold to students and faculty. Due to COVID-19 masks were used. 3000 Masks were stitched and distributed freely to students of PUC II year students appearing exams, labours, faculty, non-teaching staff. On important occasion samplings were gifted to the guests.

7.2 – Best Practices

7.2.1 - Describe at least two institutional best practices

I] The institution has a Health Care Centre. 1) Aim : It aims to take care of the student health throughout the completion of their programme. 2) Objective : The main objective is to provide first aid to students has they come early morning by 8 am. Lunch is also provided to help them attend noon classes and until they reach home. Regular check-up help them know them their physical fitness. 3) Context : Imparting education is not sufficient . Health of the students is of prime importance. Since our students are only females their health must never be neglected at any state of life. A lady doctor is available anytime in time of emergency. The centre has complete first aid kit. Sometimes students are treated in an emergency, usually during morning hours - the reason

is weakness or acidity. Every year the first year students are physically checked the anthropometric reading is taken height, weight chest measurement. Underweight students are advised, dietary pattern is checked, food habits are checked and effective advice is given to them. The students are advised to eat before they come to the class. For their convenience there is a short break after the first class to eat their breakfast. During lunch time students carry from home and for those who do not get the college has started " Dasoha Prasada Nilaya". Through this students are provided with fresh made rice, dal and pickle at subsidised rate of Rs. 5/-. There is a college kitchen a cook is appointed, non-teaching staff is in-charge of the catering. Students are provided lunch so that they are fit to attend the noon classes and reach home safely. Blood Group, Test, Eye-check up, Dental check-up for all students of the college. The medical check-up was provided to the parents during their visit to college. Local homeopathic college distributed tablets for Corona. The district health centre distributed tablets for elephantiasis. During the spread of COVID-19 during lockdown cooked food was distributed to the needy to take care of their health in times of emergency. The institution cause for the healthy society. The management and our Sangha which has established their college is based on the two values of ' Kayaka' and ' Dasoha'. II] The institution provides Earn While You Learn Schemes. 1) Aim : Such schemes are in practice to help students learn new talent and skills at early state in life. 2) Objectives : The main objective is to develop creative skills, selfreliance, self-motivation, create social rapport and to earn their livelihood or supplement their family income. 3) Context : Since girls of this region need to be train at the early age as they have to balance between their personal life and family life. Such schemes will promise them to have a sustainable future. It helps to promote the confidence of girls for their future survival. It helps them develop their skills and when in a group they exchange ideas and instil team spirit in them. " "Tailoring and Embroidery" has helped students to invest minimum and earn better as the college provides machines and some of the materials needed. Students have stitched garments, handkerchiefs and scarfs. Cotton bags and hand bags. Since plastic is out of use the sale of cloth bags was in great demand. The end of the academic year, this year being hit by the COVID-19 facemasks were in great demand. Thousands of masks were stitched by the centre. It was very handy during these pandemic times. During Ganesh Chaturthi idols of Lord Ganesh were prepared by the students. They were made of the clay which is available freely. Now that plaster of Paris is banned this year there was a great demand for the clay idols of Ganesh. Different styles and shapes and sizes of the idols were sold at reasonable rates. Rakhi festival is also celebrated which demands the making of Rakhis by the students. Wholesale threads and beads and necessary materials are bought at low cost and are sold at reasonable rates. Student's faculty from the institution and also the neighbouring institution purchased. Students of Fine Art Department benefitted a lot . During the festival of lamps 'Deepawali' clay lamps were prepared by the students of Fine Art Department, several shapes and designs with beautiful colours used were attractive. There was a good sale this time as the consciousness among students was aroused not to purchase from malls and outside markets. This was to enrich the student's confidence that they can survive on their own if they invest minimum amount time skills and energy. They not only earn but gain social recognition, come in contact with several people which boost their morale. An additional sale was the sale of pearl ornaments. Students purchased pearls of reasonable rates in wholesale budget and prepared ornaments like earnings, finger rings, bracelets, bangles and necklaces made of pearls. Their talent and skills in preparation earned them more than their investments. The institution being a women's college, there was a great demand for such ornaments. The department of Fine Art also undertook the job of Fabric Painting .Selected students who have trained themselves in this art of fabric

painting could also expand their money pockets. Fabric painting is expensive

affair as the material used has to be bought bearing in mind the quality and quantity of the fabric used, the fabric colors and the brushes. Time investment is also there. The art of drawing and coloring requires the skills of the growing artists. It serves a platform for them to grow as great artists in future. This is a rare art as only those take up who are really interested and committed and are passionate about this art. The Fine Art department serves the necessary inspiration and taste in the students to take up this art.

7.3 – Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 – Provide the details of the performance of the institution in one area distinctive to its vision, priority and thrust in not more than 500 words

The institution emphasises on all round development of girl students along with academic programmes there are several co-curricular activities and extracurricular activities to empower girls to grow as a responsible citizen. There are literacy, cultural, sports, NSS, NCC, Ranger units. Students are from local area and from nearby rural areas. Uniform, prayer, exercise, Yoga, Karate is mandatory. Bridge Course is conducted before admission. Admission is given to all. The institution has nearly 50 years experience, the President of our Top Management has struggled to educate girls of this region. 'Dasoha' and 'Kayaka' are the two 'mantras' of our Management. Lunch for students is prepared in college and served at rate of Rs. 5/-. Seminars, Workshops, group discussion, projects are conducted by all departments. Discrimination is not entertained. Best practices are introduced to enhance the quality of education. General Knowledge test, quiz programmes mentoring is compulsory. Students participate in national, international, regional seminars and conferences. Students Academy - 'Kala-Vani' functions very systematically. Regular meetings are conducted for the Academy. National festivals, observation of special days like, Jayanti's fo Swami Vivekananda, Maharshi Valmiki, Netaji Subaschandra Bose, Sant Kanakadas , Gandhi Jayanti, Lal Bhahadur Shastri Jayanti are all observe. The institution observed International Yoga Day, World Music day, World Population Day, Breast Feeding Day, International Sports Day, Teachers Day, World Literacy Day, World Student Day, Human Rights Day, Kuvempu's Birthday, National Voters Day and International Women's Day . Invited scholars speak on importance of the day to imbibe good values in students. Students participate in week-long NSS Camp and attend NCC Camps, Karate Coaching Camp, Traffic Rules, Flood Relief Rally and International Women's Day Rally. Emphasis is on folk literature. Tailoring and Embroidery, Drawing and Painting, Baking and Pickle making, Clay articles preparations help students to exhibit skills through `earn while learn' schemes . The stake holders - Parents during Parent-Teacher Meet expressed their happiness with institutional academic agenda. Retired Teachers and Alumni Association have instituted cash awards for meritorious students and for higher education. Mentoring and counselling help building a healthy rapport between mentor and mentee. Value -added courses along with English and Kannada languages certificate courses are regular. Special lectures and Teacher-exchange programmes are organised. Needy students benefit with fee concession, uniforms, books and lunch. Due to COVID-19 from end of March to end of May 2020, our institution was the first, locally, to undertake initiatives of distributing masks to PUC students appearing examination and people in the vicinity. Cooked food, with water, for a month, was distributed for needy people during the crucial times. Online classes started immediately on the announcement of lock-down. Counselling and meetings were conducted virtually. Stringent measures were taken to keep the campus speckles clean Sanitizer, masks and hand -glows were distributed to the faculty

and staff. COVID-19 CELL served in a befitting manner. Important news is conveyed immediately through newspapers. College Magazine, help student and faculty to enhance their research activities. The institution situated on Sharanabasveshwar Temple Campus is blessed by the local deity.
